

Carroll women trip Lady Argos

HELENA — Torrie Cahill scored 21 points and Carroll College outscored the University of Great Falls by 13 points at foul line en route to a 73-60 victory Saturday night in Frontier Conference women's action.

Sophomore guard Sarah Sciascia scored 18 points and freshman center Lindsey Abramson had 15 for the Lady Argos, who fell to 1-4 in league play and 7-11 overall.

"We played really hard," said UGF head coach Bill Himmelberg. "Our young girls are getting lots of experience. We just need to keep working."

Jeni Guertin had 14 points and former C.M. Russell High standout Jordan Bagley had eight for Carroll (1-4, 8-10). The Saints were 21-for-25 from the foul line. Great Falls was 8-for-12 from the stripe.

The Lady Argos return to McLaughlin Center next weekend as teams from Westminster and Lewis-Clark State come to Great Falls.
