

GREAT FALLS, Mont. – It was Senior Night at the McLaughlin Center as the University of Great Falls honored 7 seniors who are playing their last year of college volleyball. The match was against the 9th ranked team in the nation, the Lewis-Clark State College Warriors. The Warriors came in with a 10-1 Conference Record and are 16-3 overall. The Argos are 2 games above .500 at 6-4 and 21-5 overall. The last time these two team met in Lewiston, ID the Warriors made short work of the Argos and sent them on the road after 3 games.

Tonight would prove to be a bit different. The Argos were led by Thousand Oaks, Calif. Junior Kelsey VanUden who hammered down 15 kills. Just behind her was Senior Tosha Nunes, from Fallon, Nev., with 14. But the Warriors are not 9th ranked for nothing. Lauryn Herrick had 14 kills and right behind her was the team kill leader, Kelli Tikker with 12. Tikker also had 15 digs. Senior Kyah Piva had 10 digs.

The Warriors took game 1 25-18. The Argos won game 2 28-26. The Warriors answered winning game 3 25-17. It was the Argos turn and they tied the match at 2 by winning game 4 25-19. Then the Argos luck ran short as they fell in the 5th and deciding game 15-5 after leading 3-1. The Argos fall to 6-5 in conference play and 21-6 overall while the Warriors improve to 17-3 overall and 11-1 in conference play.

The Argos are home tomorrow for their final home match of the season at 2:00 pm against Westminster College and will attempt to avenge their earlier loss in 5 games in Salt Lake City.

The Argos travel to Billings on the 4th to take on Rocky Mountain and to Helena on the 6th to battle Carroll College before the Frontier Conference Tournament begins.
