Lady Argos Take 4 More From Dawson

Great Falls, MT – The University of Great Falls softball team won four more exhibition games over the last two days over visiting Dawson Community College, winning by scores of 3-2 and 9-1 on Saturday before taking 4-2 and 7-5 decisions on Sunday. The wins make UGF 6-0 in these exhibition bouts vs. Dawson in this, their first and only home-stand of the season. The team remains 14-11 officially on the season.

“We’re getting more and more consistent every day,” said UGF head coach **Gary Ehnes**. “I’m not sure if we would have won a few of these games a couple weeks ago. Also, this is the best Dawson team I’ve seen so give them credit too because they played pretty well.”

Sunday’s games proved to be the best of the bunch. Under clear skies and with temperatures soaring above 70 degrees in the afternoon, the Lady Argos won in come-from-behind fashion in game one while then using a dominant pitching performance to establish a big lead in game two.

With the Lady Argos down 2-1 in the bottom of the sixth, hometown product **Amanda Morris (Great Falls, MT)**, who played her first two collegiate seasons for Dawson, drove a steak through the heart of her former team as she hit a three-run homer over the fence in center field to give the Lady Argos their winning margin.

Game two was dominated by junior pitcher **Ashley Densmore (Vancouver, WA)**. Densmore started the game and retired all 15 batters she faced over the first five innings before being lifted in favor of sophomore **Casey Olson (Spokane, WA)**. Densmore also struck out six batters while inducing six ground ball outs as well.

“Densmore was really throwing well today,” Ehnes said. “That might be the best we’ve seen out of her all year long as she’s been struck by the injury bug a little bit. I know she had a perfect game going but I thought it was important for Casey to get some work in as well.”

At the plate in game two, the Lady Argos got a solo homer from junior **Anna Owen (Toledo, WA)** which was later followed by a two-run blast from sophomore **Desiree Clarke (Whitefish, MT)**.

With these games behind them, the Lady Argos turn their attention to this coming weekend’s trip to Minot State where they have four games scheduled. The Lady Beavers were in action today putting their current 11-game win streak on the line against Black Hills State. The Lady Argos need at least a 2-2 split in next weekend’s games to qualify for the Cal-Pac Conference playoffs for the first time in team history.

“It won’t be easy,” Ehnes said in contemplating next weekend’s challenge. “Minot is a tough team and they’re playing really well right now. But, if we come to play I’m confident taking my team up against anybody. The one thing I do know is that it will be fun.”
