

Great Falls, MT- It was a beautiful day at the Meadow Lark Country Club in Great Falls, MT. The first round of the University of Great Falls Invitational golf tournament began with 88 degree weather along with a slight breeze to keep the contestants cool. Several Frontier Conference schools competed in the tournament.

Jim Mee of Carroll College had a great day. He fired a 5-under-par 67 Monday to grab the lead after the first round of the 36-hole event.

Rocky Mountain College's Rachel Hosterman and Brittani Jones set the pace on Monday; both fired a 76 to conclude day one.

Mee's fine round led the men after 18 holes. Carroll teammate Taylor Ratliff fired a 3-under 69 and entered Tuesday's final round just two shots off the pace. Tom Meyer and Connor Rakowski of Rocky Mountain were tied for third place Monday at 73.

Kiley McConnell of Carroll shot a 77, while Margo Salsbery of Miles Community College fired a 79.

The University of Great Falls teams were led by Chelsea Kenner, who shot an 81, which was good for fourth place among the women. The UGF men's team was led by Indy Kimura, who fired a 76.

The temperature dropped and the wind speed picked up on Tuesday. In 75 degrees and 12 mph wind speed the ball did not fly the same as the previous day.

Rachel Hosterman of Rocky Mountain shot a 78 to finish with a 154 to take the Women's Title. Connor Hausauer of Carroll College fired a 68 the second day to finish the tournament at 145 and capture the Men's Title. One shot behind Hausauer was Jim Mee, the first round leader.

The Rocky Mountain women and Carroll College men earned team titles.

The top finishers from the University of Great Falls were Chelsea Kenner, who finished tied for third in the women's competition, and Indy Kimura, who finished with a 153 total for the Argo men.
